
FAIRMOUNT IN LUBLIN

All donations go directly to refugee relief

In July, PCM sent \$30,000 to Poland for the purpose of Ukrainian refugee relief:

1) Distribution centers in Poland - \$8,000 for food

2) Ostroda Camp, Polish churches, and other housing - \$13,000 for food and utilities 3) Transports to Ukraine from various Polish cities - \$9,000

PCM will continue to send funds to our Polish churches to help them provide for the basic needs of Ukrainian refugees as long as this need exists and funds are available.

Many Ukrainians living in Poland still need help to make ends meet. E.g., this Ukrainian family appreciated the help provided them by Pastor Jarek Sciwiarski: a new refrigerator, funds for basic needs, and the opportunity for the kids to go on a summer excursion.


Praise God for ...
